

BADMINTON



Screaming speed, lightning-quick reactions, pinpoint accuracy, grace and subtlety – Badminton is a complex game with demanding conditions, conditions available at Maples Pavilion on the campus of Stanford University.

Maples Pavilion features the ceiling height necessary for Badminton's high lobs. Its air-handling equipment can be turned off so as not to disturb the flight of the shuttlecock, yet because of its below-grade design, Maples Pavilion will still maintain comfortable temperatures, even in summer. And as anyone who has ever attended a collegiate basketball game in Maples will tell you, its intimate seating for 7,000 spectators creates one of the most electrifying atmospheres in the nation, a fitting atmosphere for a sport that has captured the imagination and passion of huge audiences throughout the world.

Finally, Maples Pavilion offers its own excellent support facilities and those in the immediately adjacent Arrillaga Family Sports Center, including warm-up courts, athletes facilities, media facilities and Olympic Family Lounge.

As part of the Olympic Stadium cluster at Stanford, Maples Pavilion will provide an opportunity to showcase one of the most exciting and popular sports in the world.

- Menlo-Atherton High School, Atherton
- Menlo High School, Menlo Park
- St. Francis High School, Mountain View
- Palo Alto High School, Palo Alto
- Gunn High School, Palo Alto

After the Olympic Games, Maples Pavilion will continue to function as an arena for intercollegiate athletics at Stanford University.

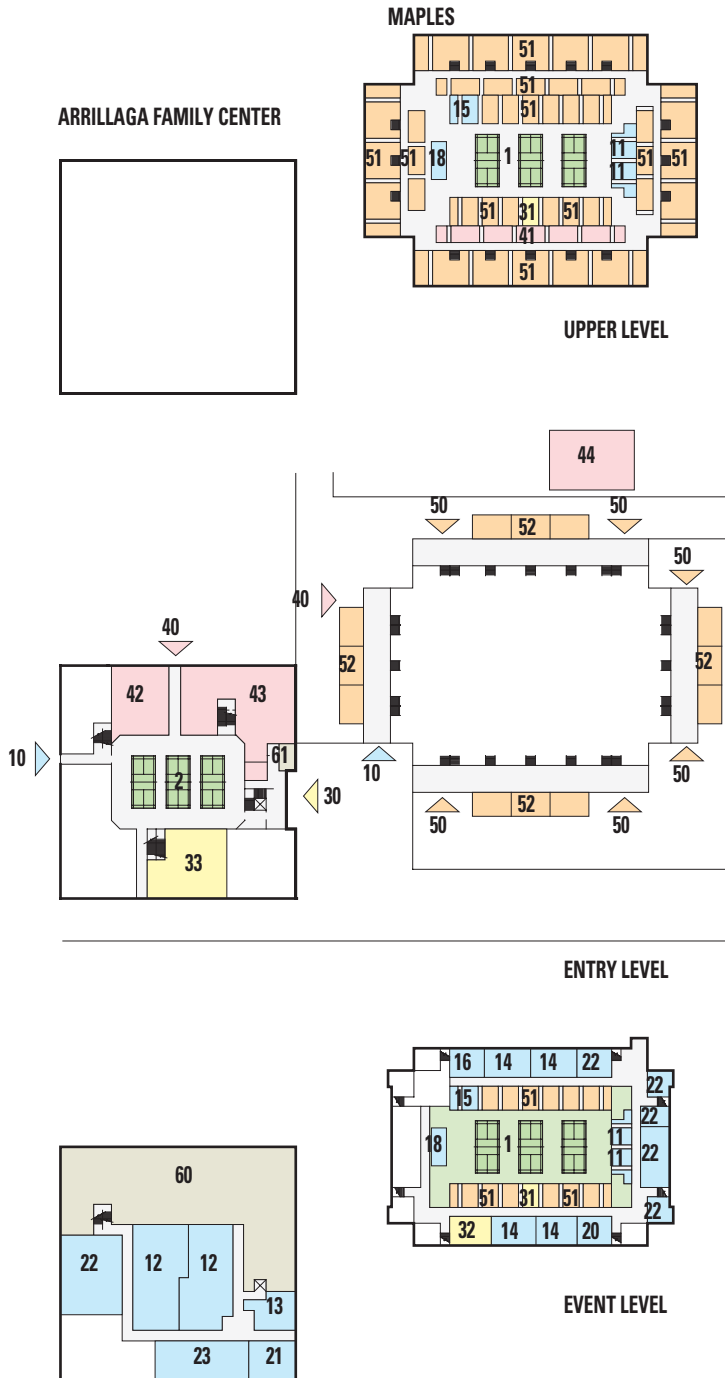
