

## SHOOTING



To design a new shooting center for the San Francisco Bay Area, one that would provide a lasting legacy and also meet the requirements for the Olympic Games in 2012, BASOC assembled a team of highly experienced experts who have worked at previous Olympic Games and many other major shooting competitions. The resulting venue can meet the needs of the Olympic Games or a world championship, but will also serve the local community for training and recreation.

The San Jose Shooting Center will be established on a site with existing ranges at the Santa Clara County Sheriff's Shooting Facilities, just south of the city. The Finals Hall will extend from the 50m Range and provide seating for 2,500, while the Finals Range for Skeet and Trap will provide seating for 5,000. Additional seating is available at each of the other ranges, all designed to provide the best conditions for athletes and spectators.

Space for all the necessary technical facilities, meeting rooms and offices is provided, with a club house/restaurant area designated for future development to serve as the Olympic Family Lounge.

An entry courtyard leads past the 10m Range to a spectator plaza that will provide a great atmosphere with enough space to allow for easy movement from event to event.

The competition venue will be used for training.

Indicate on the map the distance in miles, kilometers and travel time (in current and future conditions, and if improvements are planned between these different sites).

The location of the Shooting venue at the San Jose Shooting Center is indicated on **Map 10.3 – Shooting**. This map also shows the relationship of the venue to the Olympic Village, the MPC, the IBC, the Judges and Referees Village, the Media Hotel Cluster and the Media Village.

- For those venues already existing, give dates of commencement and completion of any work necessary. Also indicate the original date of construction for each venue.
  - For those venues to be built, give dates of commencement and completion of construction.
- 10.4.3** Cost:
- Estimated cost of work required;
  - Financing arrangements (amount in figures and percent total).
- 10.4.4** Name of current owner (and of future owner if venue is to change hands) and current status of agreements with owners concerning use if site for the Olympic Games, indicating whether these are already signed or to be negotiated (in accordance with the guarantees given in Section 9.1.5).

After the Olympic Games, the San Jose Shooting Center will be used for police training, elite athlete training, competitions and recreational shooting.

- Technical installations required

### 10.7.2 Capacity for Olympic Games

- Total number of seats

The total number of available seats for Shooting at the San Jose Shooting Center is 7,500 (2,500 in the Finals Hall). In total, 6,450 seats are reserved for the general public.
